

Abbreviated Instruction to Authors

Submission of papers

Papers should be submitted online at <http://submit.expphysiol.org>. Authors experiencing difficulty submitting online should contact the Publications Office (Email: eward@physoc.org).

The submission of a paper will be taken to imply that it is unpublished and is not being considered for publication elsewhere. A signed Exclusive Licence form will be required upon acceptance, available on the online submission system.

Preparation of manuscripts

Manuscripts should be prepared according to the full Instructions for Authors available online at <http://ep.physoc.org/>. Authors should take particular care to ensure that they prepare their electronic figures using suitable software so that publication quality files can be produced for the print issue.

Arrangement of the manuscript

There should be a separate title page, with the names of the authors (in any preferred order), their addresses, the name, postal and email addresses, telephone and fax numbers to which correspondence and proofs should be sent and a short title (<70 letters and spaces) for use as a running head. The number of words should also be indicated. All papers (except review articles) should then be arranged as follows: Extract, Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion, References, Acknowledgements, Tables, Figure legends.

Tables and figures

Tables should be kept to a minimum.

A separate legend should be supplied for each figure and parts should be labelled A, B, C etc. Sans serif fonts e.g. Arial or Helvetica should be used for all figure labelling. Figures should be provided at their final size: 84 mm, 114 mm or 173 mm wide. For full details of requirements for figure preparation, please see <http://jp.physoc.org/misc/itafigs.shtml>

Colour figures are encouraged where they enhance scientific value, but authors will be expected to pay for the cost of printing in colour. A completed Colour Work Agreement form should be supplied on submission, which includes the costs of colour reproduction.

References

In the list of references, abbreviated titles of journals should be given according to the conventions of *Biological Abstracts/Medline/ISI* (e.g. *Exp Physiol*). Authors must ensure that the wording of references to unpublished work is approved by the persons concerned.

Acknowledgements

Authors must ensure that the wording of acknowledgements of help or criticism is approved by the persons concerned.

Ethics of experimentation

Papers describing animal experiments can be accepted for publication only if the experiments conform with the principles of UK legislation. Authors are expected to provide evidence that they took adequate steps to ensure that animals did not suffer unnecessarily. In experiments involving the use of neuromuscular blocking agents authors must additionally describe the precautions taken to ensure the adequacy of anaesthesia.

Whenever appropriate, a statement should be included indicating that experiments were performed in accordance with national legislation where this exists or, in its absence, with the requirements of the named institution/local body concerned with the ethics of experimentation.

Papers describing experiments on human subjects must include a statement that the experiments were performed with the understanding and consent of each individual or of the legal guardian in the case of minors. In this connection, authors' attention is drawn to the *Code of Ethics of the World Medical Association (Declaration of Helsinki)*, updated 2004 and to the Medical Research Council's pamphlet *Responsibility in Investigations on Human Participants and Material and on Personal Information* (1996). Authors must state in their paper that studies conformed to the standards set by the *Declaration of Helsinki* and that the procedures were approved by the local ethics committee. Authors will find additional guidelines on the web page.

Proofs

Authors will receive a PDF version of the proof for corrections. This should be corrected and returned quickly: correction should be kept to a minimum. Proof corrections should be returned as instructed.

Offprints

A complimentary copy of the relevant issue of the journal will be sent to all corresponding authors, together with a PDF file of their paper. Offprints can be supplied if ordered at the same time as the proofs are returned.

Copyright

Upon acceptance of a paper the entire copyright shall pass to the Physiological Society. A completed Copyright Assignment Form must be supplied for all papers before publication.
