Origin

The *Quarterly Journal of Experimental Physiology*, founded in 1908 by Sir Edward Sharpey-Schafer, Professor of Physiology, University of Edinburgh, became a publication of The Physiological Society in 1981. The title was changed to *Experimental Physiology* in 1990.

Scope

Experimental Physiology publishes the following types of papers:

1. Research Papers which report the results of original research;
2. Hot Topic Reviews, which provide an accessible synthesis of current information in topical areas of physiology. These are normally limited to 3000 words and usually solicited by the Editorial Board;
3. Review Articles, which discuss, critically and concisely, current developments of interest to physiologists. These are normally limited to about 20 printed pages and are solicited by the Editorial Board;
4. Symposium Reports, which report concisely presentations given as part of symposia at scientific meetings.
5. Exchange of Views, which present two opposing opinions on a topical subject published with commentary and responses from each participating author.
6. Themed Issue papers which can take the form of any of the above paper types focusing on the specified 'Theme'.
