Guidelines for submitting Lectures for publication

Publication of Lectures is by invitation of the Editorial Board..
Experimental Physiology publishes regular lectures given at The UK Physiological Society Meetings see <http://www.physoc.org/meetings/prizelectures/>
It also publishes selected Lectures from other Scientific Meetings.

The format and style of 'Lecture' articles are flexible. As a guide they are not normally expected to exceed 5,000 words.

Please do not forget to include full contact details on the title page of the article.
Details of the Lecture title plus where and when it was given should also be included.

An abstract of up to 200 words should be included with the article for use by the abstracting services. This should be clearly distinguished from the introductory paragraph and contain no direct citations.

Illustrations are strongly encouraged. There is no charge for colour figures online and as an invited author you will be entitled to one essential colour figure free of charge in print. References should be limited to 50, if possible. We would advise you to refer to *Experimental Physiology's* Instructions to Authors <http://ep.physoc.org/misc/ifora.shtml> to make sure that the format of your references and figures is correct.

The article will be peer-reviewed by a member of the Editorial Board and/or expert referees, to ensure factual accuracy, appropriate citations and scholarly balance.

Authors should request permission from other journals in good time if they wish to reproduce material that has already been published. If the material is from your own work, please note this in your request. Articles cannot be published online or in print if permission documents are not received on time.
